OBTAINING AND MAINTAINING YOUR CA CONTRACTORS LICENSE

California law requires that all contractors operating in the State be properly licensed by the Contractors State License Board (CSLB). Harsh penalties may assessed against an unlicensed contractor for performing work in California. An unlicensed contractor may be subject to both civil and criminal penalties and disciplinary action by the CSLB.

California Contractors License Law & Reference Book. We have selected the portions that may be helpful while going through the application process.

Currently, the typical processing time for a new California contractor's license is 3-6 months. While applicant fingerprinting and background check requirements cause can some delays, the most common delay is due to incomplete and incorrect applications submitted CSLB.

AVAILABILITY LIST UPDATE


