#### FUN FACTS ABOUT U.S. INDEPENDENCE DAY

It was actually July 2, 1776 that America gained its independence. So why do we celebrate on July 4? The fact is that John Adams wrote home to Abigail on the 3<sup>rd</sup> that this day, July 2<sup>nd</sup>, will go stated that "We'll celebrate it with parades and pomp and ringing and bells fireworks". And it was because Congress actually ruled the 4<sup>th</sup> as the dav of independence that we celebrate it as such because that is the day Congress that accepted Jefferson's declaration.

Only 2 men signed the Declaration of Independence on July 4<sup>th</sup> 1776 – John Hancock (not the big signature) and Charles Thompson, Secretary of Congress

The Liberty Bell had nothing to do with July 4<sup>th</sup>. It wasn't called the "Liberty Bell" until the 1830's and that's also when it got its famous crack


